On October 6, 2017 at 5:05 pm, Officer Mullooly responded to a residence in Overlook Village for investigative purposes. While at the residence, Officer Mullooly came in contact with a male, who was identified as Mr. Giraldo-Acosta. A check of Mr. Giraldo-Acosta's credentials showed an active warrant for Mr. Giraldo-Acosta's arrest for \$500.00 out of Dover, NJ. Mr. Giraldo-Acosta was placed under arrest, and transported to police headquarters. Mr. Giraldo-Acosta was unable to post, and was subsequently turned over to Dover Police.

<b>Incident/Event:</b>	Put the Brakes on Fatalities
<b>Date:</b>	October 10, 2017

“**Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day**” was established in 2001 to focus attention on reducing the traffic fatalities that occur each year in the United States. Nationally, there were 35,092 roadway deaths in 2015, while New Jersey lost 603 individuals on the State’s roadways in 2016. As part of a continuing effort in “moving toward zero fatalities,” motorists, pedestrians, motorcyclists, and bicyclists are asked to take extra care on October 10 to prevent traffic crashes and make this a fatality-free day across New Jersey. To reinforce this lifesaving message and further support the initiative the Mount Olive Police Department reminds you to leave a few minutes earlier for work, pay attention to your surroundings while driving, to put down your cell phone while driving, and to arrive safely at you destination. In addition:

Car drivers should never drink and drive.

Motorcycle drivers should watch the "No-Zones". Never hang out in a truck's blind spot or "No-Zone".

Truck and bus drivers take care of yourself! The most important part of a moving truck or bus is the driver. Get plenty of rest before getting behind the wheel, eat well and stay fit.

Pedestrians should pay attention to stopping distances. Use caution when crossing intersections and streets. You may think vehicles will stop for you, but they may not see you or even be able to stop. Never take a chance with a truck, even if the driver sees you, they may not be able to stop. Truck brakes and gears are notorious for sticking.

Bicyclists must ride with traffic. Ride on the right side, with the flow of traffic.
